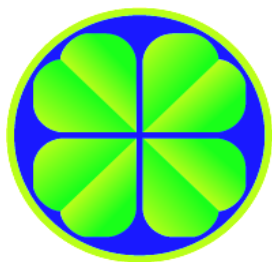

Summer 2018 POP Awards

This half term we are celebrating the Power of Presentation.

These are the awards we are aiming to achieve

POP1 – My handwriting shows improvement.

When we look at your work, we can see that the way you form the letters, the way you join letters OR the way you use spaces between words is improving. You can earn more than one POP1 Award because you can keep improving!

POP2 – My handwriting shows consistent improvement.

When we look at your work, we can see at least three pieces of work – one after the other – that show you are using your improved skills.

POP3 - My work shows great care.

When we look at your work, we can see that you have thought carefully about the handwriting and presentation you use in every lesson.

POP4 – I can use presentation to enhance my work.

You have produced one or more pieces of work that you have made more special, or more effective, by the careful thought you have given to presentation. This could be any sort of work - a leaflet; a poster; a report; a poem etc. It might be work produced in maths, science or any other subject.

POP5 – I am a handwriting mentor.

You have shared your skills with someone else to support, encourage, or inspire them to make improvements in their handwriting.
